Dear friends,

This week I visited Our Lady of Sacred Heart (OLSH) college talking to the Year Seven's about prayer. Drawing from St Teresa of Avila, the Doctor of prayer, her understanding of prayer is 'an intimate friendship/relationship, spending time frequently, with the one who loved me first'. Like any friendship to grow, one needs to spend time with the other. The same applies to God. In order to get to know a friend, one needs to spend time. Prayer is a gift from God and our response is simply so because God loved us first. Prayer is an exchange of receiving and giving, talking and listening.

I then used Mother Teresa's of Calcutta saying which was helpful in my own priestly discernment to highlight the step by step journey towards God. The fruit of silence is prayer, the fruit of prayer is faith, the fruit of faith is love, the fruit of love is service, the fruit of service is peace.

Next, I used the acronym A.C.T.S. to show the components of prayer: A- Adoration, C-Contrition, T-Thanksgiving, S-Supplication. I explained to the girls, our prayer life has a personal and public dimension to it. The intention of my visit is to explain the transforming effects of both the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Recognising our need for God's life, God's love, God's light, God's Communion on a regular basis. God wants each and every one of us to be with Him in heaven, and He gives us all the necessary help to do so.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available to the Year 7 students over the upcoming two weeks.

On Sunday 28 October after 9am Mass at OLMC Waterloo, there will be a table set up with all you need to decorate your very own piece to add to our artwork.

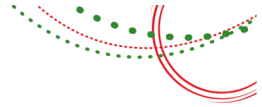

# Liturgy of the Word

## First Reading Is 53:10-11

*If he offers his life in atonement, he shall see his heirs, and have long life.*

The Lord has been pleased to crush his servant with suffering. If he offers his life in atonement, he shall see his heirs, he shall have a long life and through him what the Lord wishes will be done. His soul's anguish over he shall see the light and be content. By his sufferings shall my servant justify many, taking their faults on himself.

## Responsorial Psalm Ps 32:4-5. 18-20. 22. R. v.22

**(R.) Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.**

1. The word of the Lord is faithful and all his works to be trusted. The Lord loves justice and right and fills the earth with his love. **(R.)**
2. The Lord looks on those who revere him, on those who hope in his love. to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine. **(R.)**

Since in Jesus, the Son of God, we have the supreme high priest who has gone through to the highest heaven, we must never let go of the faith that we have professed. For it is not as if we had a high priest who was incapable of feeling our weaknesses with us; but we have one who has been tempted in every way that we are, though he is without sin. Let us be confident, then, in approaching the throne of grace, that we shall have mercy from him and find grace when we are in need of help.

## Gospel Mk 10:35-45 (or shorter form Mk 10:42-45)

*The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for all.*

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the

baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.' When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'
